what is PUBLIC ART?

Public art is not an art "form." Its size can be huge or small. It can tower fifty feet high or call attention

to the pavement beneath your feet. Its shape can be abstract or realistic (or both), and it may be cast, carved, built, assembled, or painted. It can be site-specific or stand in contrast to its surroundings. It often interprets

the history of the place, its people, and sometimes addresses a social or environmental issue.

Many of the pieces are funded through public art ordinances. The remaining pieces were funded by

businesses and community groups, and we are thankful for their continued support of public art projects.
